The following letter of recommendation is what I composed from scripture and my own thoughts, for this year's high school graduation cards. It's original intent was the apostle Paul's sending forth greetings to his churches and so I find it somewhat appropriate to share with you.

Letter of Recommendation 2 Corinthians chapter 3, verses 1 through 6.

"Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Or do we need, as some do, letters of recommendation to you, or from you? You yourselves are our letter of recommendation, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all. And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God.

In verse 2, "You yourselves are our letter of recommendation." Notice the nature of this letter. From Christ, that is Christ in you, delivered or ministered by us, that is through our ministry; written not with ink but with the Spirit, by the power of God; not on tablets of stone but on tablets of the human heart.

What do we really rely on? What really makes a person someone that you can trust? I have a certificate, I have something framed, I have a diploma, I know important people, I have accomplishments... Or, is it ultimately that people's lives have been changed because they have known us? Through the years of your child-hood and upbringing, through the ministry of the church, from the education of the school, from your receiving of community support. Are you ready to take your place as a productive supportive Member of society? As your pastor, and as the congregation of the United Methodist Church here at Hampton, Aredale and Dumont, we wish you the best that God has to give in this life and the next. May your next stage in life be filled with hope, joy, peace and love. May your journey through the crossroads of life be blessed.


